DIPLOMA PROGRAM:

Successful completion of core.

Completion of six subjects, one in each group outlined.

A minimum of three HL courses and three SL courses, with a minimum of one from each group. No more than four subjects can be taken at HL.

Completion of IB course internal and external assessments.

CAREER-RELATED PROGRAM:

Successful completion of core.

A minimum of two HL or SL subject courses, preferably one within the career-related study (CTE Pathway).

What is an IB Education?

The IB continuum of international education for 3 to 19-year olds is unique because of its academic and personal rigor. We challenge students to excel in their studies and in their personal growth. We aim to inspire a quest for learning throughout life that is marked by enthusiasm and empathy.

The IB aspires to help schools develop well-rounded students with character who respond to challenges with optimism and an open mind, are confident in their own identities, make ethical decisions, join with others in celebrating our common humanity and are prepared to apply what they learn in real-world, complex and unpredictable situations - *IBO.org*

THE CAREER-RELATED PROGRAM CORE

THE DIPLOMA PROGRAM CORE:

- The Reflective Project asks students to engage in an indepth body of work. Through the reflective project, students identify analyze, discuss and evaluate an ethical dilemma associated with an issue from their career-related studies.
- The Personal Professional Skills course develops responsibility, practical, problem-solving, good intellectual habits and an ethical understanding, among other skills. The emphasis of the course is placed on the development of skills needed to succesfully navigate higher education, the workplace and society.
- Service Learning is the practical application of knowledge and skill toward an identified community need. Through service, students develop and apply personal and social skills in real-life situations.
- Language Development ensures that all CP students
 have access and exposure to a second language. The
 opportunity to learn a second language is central to an IB
 education and increases students' understanding of the
 wider world. Students are encouraged to begin or
 extend the study of an additional language that suits
 their needs.
- The Career-related studies (CTE Program of Study)
 are offered to provide students with practical, real-world
 approaches to learning designed to prepare them for
 higher education, an internship or apprenticeship, or a
 position in a designated field of interest.

- The Extended Essay asks students to engage in independent research through an in-depth study of a question relating to one of the DP subjects they are studying. The World Studies Extended Essay option allows students to focus on a topic of global significance, which they examine through the lens of at least two DP subjects.
- Theory of Knowledge develops a coherent approach to learning that unifies the academic disciplines. In this course on critical thinking, students inquire into the nature of knowing and deepen their understanding of knowledge as a human construction.
- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) involves students in a range of activities alongside their academic studies throughout the DP. Creativity encourages students to engage in the arts and creative thinking. Activity seeks to develop a healthy lifestyle through physical activity. Service with the community offers a vehicle for a new learning with academic value. The three strands of CAS enhance students' personal and interpersonal development through experiential learning and enable journeys of self-discovery.
