IB Diploma Program

- 6 Exams (Three standard level, three higher level, from across the curriculum. You pick your strengths to focus on in HL courses.)
 - Test scores have to equal a sum of 24 our higher
- Completion of Core Requirements:
 - Extended Essay (Developed through advisory and staff EE advisor support)
 - Creativity, Action and Service over 18 months. (Guided through advisory)
 - Theory of Knowledge with a passing mark. (ToK I during Spring Term Junior Year, ToK II during Fall Term Senior Year.)

IB Career-Related Program

- Completion of two IB Courses with passing scores of 3 or higher to be taken Jr and Sr year.
- Completion of one CTE Pathway
- Completion of Core Requirements:
 - 50 hours of second language development
 - 50 hours of service learning during junior and senior year
 - Personal Professional Skills Class (PPS) (taken during senior year)
 - Reflective Project




SRHS Career Pathways of Study


